Our preferred treatment protocol (December 2022)

NO cat should die from FIP.

\*Steroids if there is no immediate access to legal antivirals. This will buy time and helps to slow the inflammatory process that FIP is.

\*Wet FIP cats will benefit from antibiotics to cover additional potential infections linked to FIP effusions filling cavities where they should not be.

FIP Cats UK's future vision of a 'Gold Standard' FIP treatment is one involving the use of 2 antivirals in combination ie legal Remdesivir/GS-441524 and Merck licensed Molnupiravir with an immunostimulant ie Vetimmune's Polyprenyl Immunostimulant<sup>™</sup> from week 8 or after FIP treatment.

The current UK current 'Gold Standard' FIP treatment is legal Remdesivir/GS-441524 from Bova UK.

We believe an improved option on the current UK 'Gold Standard' is adding in an immunostimulant ie Vetimmune's Polyprenyl Immunostimulant<sup>™</sup> from week 8 or after FIP treatment.

For financially restricted owners (ie they are prepared to run a Go Fund Me etc) they should aim for treating for as long as possible with medication from Bova UK then consider seeking advice from eg Dr Malik, FIP Expert, Sydney University Australia about following on with Merck licensed Molnupiravir. They should also investigate using an immunostimulant ie Vetimmune's Polyprenyl Immunostimulant<sup>™</sup> from week 8 or after FIP treatment.

For owners faced with no funds they should consider seeking advice from eg Dr Malik, FIP Expert, Sydney University Australia about Merck licensed Molnupiravir and reaching out to FIP Cats UK for support to discuss this and using an immunostimulant ie Vetimmune's Polyprenyl Immunostimulant™ from week 8 or after FIP treatment.
